



## NEW Virtual Family Activities to Celebrate Springtime at the White House

April 3, 2023 (Washington, D.C.) — As the White House Easter Egg Roll approaches, the White House Historical Association is offering new <u>resources and virtual activities</u> as a compliment to this springtime tradition. The educational games and activities can be completed online with a chance to win an <u>Official 2023 White House Easter Egg Set</u>.

New games and activities offered this year include:

A Virtual White House Springtime scavenger hunt using a 360-degree virtual tour of the White House. The activity includes fun facts about the history of the Easter Egg Roll, the White House, and the people and pets who have lived in the Executive Mansion. The interactive egg hunt challenges players to find eight "fun facts" about the history of the Easter Egg Roll and other springtime traditions placed throughout the Executive Mansion. A "fill in the blank" worksheet can be completed when all the "fun facts" are located. Completed worksheets can be submitted for a chance to win an Official 2023 White House Easter Egg Set.

<u>Printable Coloring Page</u> features a 1966 image of children hunting for Easter eggs on the South Lawn at the White House Easter Egg Roll.

<u>Design Your Own Commemorative White House Easter Egg Roll Set</u> allows you to design your own version of the commemorative Official White House Easter Eggs using a template.

Easter Egg Roll Digital Puzzle uses an image of children rolling eggs on the South Lawn during the 1982 White House Egg Roll.

<u>Springtime Reading List</u> includes topics such as the White House Easter Egg Roll, gardening, and spending time outdoors.

History of the White House Easter Egg Roll includes articles/images about the first White House Egg Rolls and the evolution of this historic event.
