White House Historical Association Leverages Amazon Web Services to Expand Digitization of Historical Assets

Technology services to help increase public access to White House
history

(June 21, 2017 - Washington, DC)--- The [White House Historical Association](#) today announced a new innovative and strategic use of Amazon Web Services (AWS), expanding the Association’s digital archive and making educational materials more accessible to the public through the power of the AWS Cloud.

The White House Historical Association is leveraging the AWS Cloud to expand the digitization of White House artifacts and assets in the [Digital Library](#). The Library holds thousands of images of the White House covering its entire history, including exterior views, images of rooms and furnishings, and photos of events including inaugurations and holiday celebrations. In support of the Association’s educational mission, each image is accompanied by carefully documented historical information provided free to the public in an easy-to-use format. Using AWS will allow significant expansion of the Library through infrastructure development, advanced cloud computing technology, and other AWS Partner Network (APN) services.

The Association also plans to leverage AWS to increase access to the White House beyond physical tours with a mobile application. This app would focus on major historical elements in famous rooms of the White House, allowing people across the country to experience a White House tour with access to an online wealth of White House history.

“An important part of the White House Historical Association’s mission is education – especially for those that can’t experience it in Washington. By leveraging AWS, we will increase public access and bring White House history across the country to millions of Americans,” said Stewart D. McLaurin, White House Historical Association President.
