Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament

Gingerbread White House Ornament Commemorates Cherished White House Holiday Tradition



November 16, 2022 (Washington, D.C.) – The White House Historical Association's Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament celebrates what has become a cherished and longstanding holiday tradition at the White House: displaying a gingerbread house each holiday in the State Dining Room.

Gingerbread was used for holiday decorations in the Executive Mansion, but it wasn't until 1969 that First Lady Patricia Nixon started the tradition of an annual gingerbread on display at the White House. The first gingerbread, created by White House Assistant Chef Hans Raffert, was a traditional German A-frame style house standing two feet tall and weighing 40 pounds.

Years later, the White House gingerbread displays became larger and more elaborate, particularly under White House Executive Pastry Chef Roland Mesnier, who oversaw the creation of festive villages, childhood homes, castles, national monuments and historic sites, and marzipan sculptures of the first families and their pets. During the George W. Bush presidency, Chef Mesnier created a gingerbread replica of the White House – a concept that inspired the design of the Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament.

"The Official White House Christmas Ornament is a tradition that exceeds the White House. Each year the ornament adorns millions of Christmas trees throughout the country. Collecting and gifting them has become a holiday tradition for many families," said Stewart McLaurin, President of the White House Historical Association.

The Official 2022 White House Christmas Ornament design features the White House North and South Porticos, adorned with candy canes, mints, gumdrops and swirled accents. The Official White

House Christmas Ornament is hand-crafted in the United States from solid brass, screen printed with enamel inks, and packaged in a collectible box with a scented card outlining Patricia Nixon's gingerbread recipe.

The White House Historical Association has designed and manufactured the Official White House Christmas Ornament since 1981. Each year, the ornament commemorates a president's time in the White House, in sequential order, or a significant White House anniversary.
